Subject:- Grant of Yearly Permission to Manjushree Research Institute of Ayurvedic Science, Pethapur- Mahudi Road, Near G.G.S., AT & Post-Piplaj-382610, Gandhinagar, Gujarat (Inst. ID-AYU0386) with an intake capacity of 90 seats (instead of 100 seats) in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26 as per the permission issued by the Gujarat Ayurved University - reg.

Sir/Madam,

- To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely Manjushree Research Institute of Ayurvedic Science, Pethapur- Mahudi Road, Near G.G.S., AT & Post-Piplaj-382610, Gandhinagar, Gujarat (Inst. ID-AYU0386) inspection was conducted on 27.03.2025 and 28.03.2025 in hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the permission with an intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.
- Further, the MARBISM was also in receipt of a letter from the I/c Registrar, Gujarat Ayurved University enclosing the CoA vide ref no. Acad/33/2025-26/2550 dated 13.03.2025 wherein affiliation of Gujarat Ayurved University has been given to your institute to conduct UG (BAMS) Course with 90 seats (instead of 100 seats) under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic year 2025-26.
- The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulations namely the Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals Regulations, 2024, provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder. On careful examination of the assessment report following shortcomings/defects have been observed:-

1. Teaching staffs:-

3. Further, the MARBISM is also in receipt of a letter from the I/c Registrar, Gujarat Ayurved University enclosing the CoA vide ref no. Acad/33/2025-26/2550 dated 13.03.2025 wherein affiliation of GAU is given to your institute to conduct UG (BAMS) Course with 90 seats instead of 100 seats for the academic year 2025-26.

4) The assessment report was placed in the 125th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) convened on 09.06.2025 Board discussed and decided to ask the college for Clarification regarding the aforementioned defects/ shortcoming found during the assessment and for the same a clarification letter was sent to you vide letter of even no. dated 16.06.2025. In response on the same you have submitted the clarification vide an email dated 20.06.2025 enclosing a letter vide ref. no. MRIAS/2025-26/57 dated 19.06.2025 and the submitted clarification is examined in terms of concerned Acts & Regulations and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, and after verification observation is as under:-

1. Teaching staffs:-

a) Availability of total teaching staff for UG (BAMS) Course as per the part 1 submitted by the college is

According to File No. - 26-75/MARB/2025 (Visitation) dated 20.01.2025 with subject "Policy to be adopted for the assessment and grant of denial of permission of Ayurveda Colleges for the academic Session 2025-26, and according to decision taken in the 117 th Board meeting of MARBISM held on 20.01.2024; amendment was given to all colleges stating that the 10% relaxation in the requirement of the teaching staff may be extended for the academic year 2025-26. Therefore, the colleges with 60 and 100-Intake capacity shall have minimum of 27 and 40 teaching staff respectively fulfilling the requirements of the individual departments separately. (b) Deficiency of 1 professor each in Roga Nidana Avum Vikriti Vigyan, Swasthavritta Avum Yoga and Shalakya Tantra departments; deficiency of 1 Reader each in Kriya Sharira and Kaumatabhritya-Balaroga department (5 Teachers): According to File No. - 26-75/MARB/2025 (visitation) dated 20.01.2025 it also has been mentioned, "The relaxation is applicable either for Higher or Lower faculty irrespective of any department. However, no any department should be vacant." The visitation team verified it and no department was vacant on the day of visitation. On the day of visitation, we had total 25 higher faculties, which are exceeding 19 higher faculties as mentioned in MSR-2016. Annexure-1 submitted to visitation team with their verification is attached herewith as Appendix-2.


- 5) The submission made by the college during clarification and assessment report have been carefully re-examined once again in terms of the concerned Acts & Regulations and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder and as per the direction of the competent authority the assessment report along with clarification report was placed in the 128th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) convened on 24.06.2025 and Board concluded that the college is not fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission as per the Concerned Acts and regulations but is fulfilling the criteria in accordance with the Board's policy letter issued on 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025. However, Gujarat Ayurved University has issued the CoA wherein 90 seats is granted instead of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2025-26. Hence, the Board decided to issue yearly permission with intake capacity of 90 seats (instead of 100 seats) in UG (BAMS) Course, as per the permissible intake capacity granted by Gujarat Ayurved University under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.

"DECISION"

- 6) Therefore, Yearly Permission in accordance with Regulation 54 (3) of MESAR UG Ayurveda 2024 and as per the Policy letter dated 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025 is hereby granted to Manjushree Research Institute of Ayurvedic Science, Pethapur- Mahudi Road, Near G.G.S., AT & Post-Piplaj-382610, Gandhinagar, Gujarat (Inst. ID-AYU0386) with an intake capacity of 90 seats (instead of 100 seats) in UG (BAMS) course as per the CoA issued by the Gujarat Ayurved University for the academic session 2025-26, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that aforementioned shortcomings shall be fulfilled along with the following conditions:-
- I. Minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 90 seats (instead of 100 seats) shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.
 - II. Determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
- 7) Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 8) Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.
- 9) Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 10) Compliance report of all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the implementation letters vide ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS dated 09.05.2024 and 06.09.2024 issued by the board.
- 11) The following requirements must be fulfilled and the compliance report must reach the Board by 31st December, 2025 to be considered for the issuance of permission for the academic session 2026-2027:-

- i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
 - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of Infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - iii) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
 - iv) The shortcomings mentioned in Para no. 3 above, shall be fulfilled.
- 12) The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.
